

5th - 6th GRADE MEMORY WORK

Teachers & Parents: This year's memory work will be focusing on the fundamental truths of Scripture and our confessions. Your students/child will be learning the memory work on this paper for their Catechism class. We ask that you help your child with this memory work at home while his/her Catechism teacher will do the same at church. Keep this paper for the entire school year. Here is what they will be learning:

Ten Commandments

Heidelberg Catechism Q & A 1-5, 21, 60, 65

Ten Commandments: Exodus 20

Memory work recited on the date listed.

Week 1 (Sept 9) Memory Work handed out

Week 2 (Sept 16)

- ¹ And God spoke all these words:
- ² "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery.
- ³ "You shall have no other gods before me.

Week 3 (Sept 23)

- ⁴ "You shall not make for yourself an idol in the form of anything in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below.
- ⁵ You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate me,

Week 4 (Sept 30)

- ⁶ but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love me and keep my commandments.
- ⁷ "You shall not misuse the name of the LORD your God, for the LORD will not hold anyone guiltless who misuses his name.

Week 5 (Oct 7)

- ⁸ "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.
- ⁹ Six days you shall labor and do all your work,
- ¹⁰ but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, neither you, nor your son or daughter, nor your manservant or maidservant, nor your animals, nor the alien within your gates.

Week 6 (Oct 14)

- ¹¹ For in six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but he rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy.

Westgate (Oct 21)

Week 7 (Oct 28)

- ¹² "Honor your father and your mother, so that you may live long in the land the LORD your God is giving you.
- ¹³ "You shall not murder.
- ¹⁴ "You shall not commit adultery.

Week 8 (Nov 4)

- ¹⁵ "You shall not steal.
- ¹⁶ "You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.
- ¹⁷ "You shall not covet your neighbor's house. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his manservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor."

Week 9 (Nov 11)

What is your only comfort in life and in death?

That I am not my own,
but belong
body and soul,
in life and in death—
to my faithful Savior Jesus Christ.

Week 10 (Nov 18)

He has fully paid for all my sins with his precious blood,
and has set me free from the tyranny of the devil.
He also watches over me in such a way

Week 11 (Jan 13)

that not a hair can fall from my head
without the will of my Father in heaven:
in fact, all things must work together for my salvation.

Week 12 (Jan 20)

Because I belong to him,
Christ, by his Holy Spirit,
assures me of eternal life
and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready
from now on to live for him.

Week 13 (Jan 27)

What must you know to live and die in the joy of this comfort?

Three things:
first, how great my sin and misery are;
second, how I am set free from all my sins and misery;
third, how I am to thank God for such deliverance.

Q&A 3

How do you come to know your misery?

The law of God tells me.

Q&A 4

Week 14 (Feb 3)

What does God's law require of us?

Christ teaches us this in summary in Matthew 22—
Love the Lord your God
with all your heart
and with all your soul
and with all your mind
and with all your strength.

Week 15 (Feb 10)

This is the first and greatest commandment.
And the second is like it:
Love your neighbor as yourself.
All the Law and the Prophets hang
on these two commandments

Week 16 (Feb 17)

Can you live up to all this perfectly?

No.
I have a natural tendency
to hate God and my neighbor.

Week 17 (Mar 3)

What is true faith?

True faith is not only a knowledge and conviction
that everything God reveals in his Word is true;

it is also a deep-rooted assurance,
created in me by the Holy Spirit through the gospel,
that, out of sheer grace earned for us by Christ,

Week 19 (Mar 17)

not only others, but I too,
have had my sins forgiven,
have been made forever right with God,
and have been granted salvation.

Week 20 (Mar 24)

How are you right with God?

Only by true faith in Jesus Christ.
Even though my conscience accuses me
of having grievously sinned against all God's
commandments

Week 21 (Mar 31)

and of never having kept any of them,
and even though I am still inclined toward all evil,
nevertheless,
without my deserving it at all,

Week 22 (Apr 7)

out of sheer grace,
God grants and credits to me
the perfect satisfaction, righteousness, and holiness of
Christ,

Palm Sunday & Easter Break (Apr 14 & 21)

Week 23 (Apr 28)

as if I had never sinned nor been a sinner,
as if I had been as perfectly obedient
as Christ was obedient for me.
All I need to do is to accept this gift of God with a
believing heart.

Week 24 (May 5)

*It is by faith alone
that we share in Christ and all his blessings:
where then does that faith come from?*
