

“The Borana tribe is part of the Oromo people group in Ethiopia. They number over 700,000 and are located in southern Ethiopia—a smaller number of Borana live in northern Kenya. A majority of the Borana cannot read. They are a semi-nomadic people who rely heavily on herds of cattle, goats, and camels for their livelihoods. Five to ten years ago it was very difficult to share the Gospel with any Borana person—they are steeped in traditional cultural religions such as witchcraft. In recent years, God has been softening their hearts. Now, instead of being chased out of the villages, an evangelist can bring the Borana Talking Bible to the elders and they will gladly receive it and listen. Many people are coming to faith in Jesus Christ as He answers their prayers—many more are accepting the Word of the Lord as their own and seeking to understand its meaning. The Borana have been considered an unreached people group until now. With the prayers and support of Trinity United Reformed Church in partnership with Talking Bibles, the Borana people are being reached by the Gospel through audio Talking Bibles in their heart language.”
